

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Introduction

Tatting has been the favorite form of fancy work since the 16th Century, and possesses endless possibilities of adaptation. The shuttles used at that time were exquisitely made in ivory, gold and silver, and one may see in museums the beautiful and costly inlaid shuttles.

The term Tatting is derived from an Indian word "Tattie," which means to make tight or taut,—a sort of half knotted work done with different sized shuttles and many kinds of thread. The French call it "Frivolité" from its delicate and lacy appearance. In the present day simple designs are combined with novelty braids, laces and hand embroidery, also the tatted flowers or flower shaped medallions are used in place of the solid embroidery, thus giving to these modern designs an artistic effect almost equal to the fragile and beautiful ones of the 16th Century.

Materials for Working

The materials needed for the Art of Tatting are few and simple—a shuttle, a crochet hook, and thread which has a "cable laid" twist are all that are required.

Shuttles. For ordinary work the vulcanite shuttles, which can be bought for ten cents and up, are the best. These are black and, being light weight and smooth, are more pliable and easier to handle than those of bone, mother of pearl, metal or other hard substances.

Thread. Because of its firm, even, "cable laid" twist and perfectly round surface Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet is admirably suited for tatting for the decoration of table linens, lingerie, handkerchiefs, bedroom linens, etc. Besides white it comes in ecru and linen colors to match materials used for curtains and scarfs, and in several delicate shades dyed fast colors for edgings for towels, luncheon sets and handkerchiefs which are now so popular.

Some materials, however, such as infants' flannel skirts and silk caps, ladies' crepe de Chine waists, etc., call for a silk thread. For this work Corticelli Crochet and Knitting Silk is best suited and it may be had in cream, white and in many beautiful fast colors.

Princess Pearl Crochet Cotton Size 5 may be used for Turkish towels where a soft and rather heavy edge is desired. A simple edging made of this material is also effective on huckabuck towels. It comes in white, cream and about twenty-five fast colors.


These materials come in all sizes, and the skilled needleworker will have no difficulty in selecting the size of thread suited for the work in hand. To help the less experienced, however, we have included in many of the instructions the size of thread generally used for the different articles.

More or less difficulty and inconvenience are always experienced in matching colors, the number of the color to be matched often being lost or mislaid. To avoid this we have issued Color Card No. 37 showing the actual colors and sizes in all the different Corticelli and Princess Cottons. This card costs 10 cents and may be obtained from your dealer or will be mailed direct.

Explanation of Stitches

To fill the shuttle pass thread through the hole provided for this purpose and proceed to wind until the thread projects a little beyond the sides. The stitches are made with the left hand, the thread in the right hand being held "taut" and away from you so as not to tie a knot. Tatting in reality is quite simple and if the positions of the hands in the illustrations are carefully followed there will be no difficulty in making the stitches.

Single or Half Stitch. The first thing to learn is the single or half stitch. Take shuttle in the right hand and the end of the thread between the thumb and forefinger of the left hand, placing the thread over the fingers as shown in Fig. 1, allowing thread enough for easy movement of the two fingers now under the loop. Bring it back between the thumb and forefinger, crossing the threads as shown. Pass the thread from the shuttle under the second and third finger and over little finger of your right hand, giving the shuttle the direction as shown in Fig. 1.





through the loop, hold the shuttle thread away from you and "taut" but hold the left hand motionless.

Double Stitch. Raise the third finger of the left hand to make the stitch which is the first half of the double stitch. The shuttle thread must be kept "taut" and not moved while using the left hand, as it is the left hand that completes the stitches, while the right hand or shuttle thread is the part which runs through the stitches to allow the ring to be drawn up. (Fig. 3.)





The second half of the stitch is made by passing shuttle, as shown, over the thread and under the loop between the first and third fingers of the left hand, the right hand taking the shuttle from under the empty loop, the left hand closing the stitch the same as in the first half stitch, forming the double stitch. Always allow sufficient length of thread to permit the shuttle to pass through the first and third fingers without touching them. (Fig. 4.)

Picot. After forming a double stitch the hand takes the same position as in Fig. 1. To make a picot take a long half stitch, say one fourth of an inch or more, commonly called a single stitch, separated by a double stitch.

Picots are a series of single stitches and should be of uniform size. Fig. 5 shows 1 picot, 1 double stitch and 1 picot.

Tatting with Two Shuttles. Two shuttles or shuttle and ball are used in tatting when the little rings are not to be connected at the bottom by a





thread, when you wish to hide the passage of the silk to another group of knots, and when threads of two or more colors are used.

Wind shuttle and do not cut from spool if work is to be all of one color. If in two colors then two shuttles are wound, using first one and then the other. The second shuttle thread is passed from thumb and forefinger over third finger of left hand, and, instead of forming a loop around the fingers, the thread is held with the fourth and little finger and the stitches are worked in the usual way. (Fig. 6.)

Stitches Commonly Used

These are the stitches most commonly used in tatting, grouped together. They should be thoroughly mastered by practice and a close study of the instructions in the foregoing pages.

Single or Half Stitch (Group No. 7). A group of single stitches drawn up into rings. Place thread around fingers and work 10 single stitches. Take loop off fingers, hold stitches between thumb and forefinger, and draw shuttle thread up close to form a ring, leaving one fourth of an inch of thread, and repeat.


Double Stitch (Group No. 8). A group of double stitches drawn up into rings.




Picots (Group No. 9). Leave about one fourth of an inch of thread between 5 double or complete stitches, draw up, and the picots project with the stitches.

Joining of Rings (Group No. 10). The joining stitch connects the different parts of a design. With a crochet hook draw upper thread through picot of first ring and pass shuttle through it, holding shuttle thread "taut."

Josephine Knot (Group No. 11). Used in many of the old designs; made by tatting 5 double stitches and drawing up just about half.

Dots (Group No. 12). Tat 5 double stitches and draw up almost to a ring.

Materials: For handkerchiefs or where a very small, fine edge is desired, use C M C Cordonnet Size 70 or 100. For edgings for collar and cuff sets, baby dresses, waists, lingerie or other wearing apparel, luncheon and bedroom sets, choose Size 40 or 50. For huck towel edgings select C M C Size 30, or Princess Pearl Size 5, if it is to be a narrow edge. Princess Pearl Crochet Cotton may also be used on Turkish towels. For curtains select C M C Size 30 or 40, in white, ecru or linen. For heavy linen crash for scarfs, etc., use C M C Size 3 or 5, in ecru or linen.

For baby's flannel garments, silk bonnets, etc., Corticelli Crochet and Knitting Silk is very suitable, either in cream or white, and this silk is also used for trimmings on crêpe de Chine waists, silk lingerie, etc.

Edging No. 13. The simplicity of this edging makes it very adaptable. A row or two of simple filet crochet across the top transforms it into a charming edge for dresser scarf and day pillows, towels, etc., or as an edging for Valenciennes insertion it makes a pretty waist trimming. It is also appropriate for doily or centerpiece, or made of Corticelli Crochet and Knitting Silk it is a dainty edge for baby's petticoat or bonnet.

Instructions: R. 5 d.s., 1 p., 5 d.s., 1 p., 5 d.s., 1 p., 5 d.s., close; rp., joining first p. on last p. of previous ring.

Edging No. 14 is suitable for centerpiece and doilies developed in C M C Cordonnet, in white or in shade No. 213 blue, and is equally pretty for collar and cuff sets, handkerchiefs or lingerie. It is pretty in either C M C or Princess Pearl Crochet Cotton for huck or Turkish towels; the latter material, while not so generally used, gives a nice soft edge that is very desirable, and it may be obtained either in white or in colors, blue or pink being the colors usually selected, while yellow, although a little out of the ordinary, is very attractive in a small edge for towels.


Edging No. 15. This design may also be used as an insertion and is very attractive for towels developed in C M C Cordonnet, either in white or in one of the delicate colors that may be obtained in this cotton. For Turkish towels select Princess Pearl Crochet Cotton either in white or in color.

Instructions: R. 4 d.s., 1 p., 4 d.s., 1 p., 4 d.s., 1 p., 4 d.s., close. Allow about $\frac{1}{2}$ of an inch of thread and rp., tu., allow $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of thread and rp., joining first p. to the last p. of the first ring made; rp. to desired length.

Clover Edge No. 16. For luncheon sets, towels, curtains, etc., select C M C Cordonnet.

The corner motifs are simply 5 clover leaves, with a chain of 10 d. s. between each leaf.




Dresser Scarf No. 110

The edging for this scarf is pretty in pink and white or blue and white in Princess Pearl Crochet Cotton Size 5 or C M C Cordonnet Size 40. The initial is worked in color to match the edge.

Another suggestion for a dresser scarf is to use for the edge C M C Cordonnet Size 40 in pattern 34, inserting in the four corners Medallion No. 36. A scarf with Insertion No. 57 can be finished with any edging similar to No. 34. Insertion No. 38 is effective with Edge No. 18 if the braid is omitted.

Instructions: Pink in shuttle and white ball. R. 5 d. s., 1 p., 5 d. s., 1 p., 5 d. s., close; tu. work, ch. 3 d. s., 4 p. separated by 3 d. s., 3 d. s., tu., and join to center p. Crochet 6 ch. and pick up each picot with slip stitch.



Tea Cloth and Napkins No. 111

Edge No. 112. Tatting may be used with rickrack braid to make pretty trimmings for underwear, etc., and this illustration shows a corner turned without cutting the braid. Use Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 60.

A daintier design for tea cloth and napkins can hardly be imagined, yet it is very simple to make. It is pretty in all white or with the tatting and embroidery in blue. Use C M C Cordonnet Size 40.



This little dress is exquisitely dainty and will give an idea of how many of the different patterns for tatted edgings and insertions illustrated in this book may be applied to children's clothes. The medallions of tatting combined with embroidery are unusual and most effective.







R. 3 d. s., 1 p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 3 d. s., join to center p. on ch., 3 d. s., 1 p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 3 d. s., close; tu., ch. 3 d. s., 4 p. separated by 1 d. s., 3 d. s., tu. work; R. 3 d. s., 1 p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 2 d. s., join to first p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 3 d. s., close; R. 3 d. s., join to first p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 5 d. s., join at point of ring through ch., 5 d. s., 1 p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 3 d. s., close; R. 3 d. s., join to first p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 3 d. s., close and tie; tu. work, ch. 3 d. s., 4 p. separated by 1 d. s., 3 d. s., tu. work; R. 3 d. s., join to fourth p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 3 d. s., join to center p. on ch., 3 d. s., 1 p., 2 d. s., 1 p., 3 d. s., close; tu. work, ch. 3 d. s., 4 p. separated by 1 d. s., 3 d. s., rp.

Silk Bag No. 124

By Mrs. F. L. Smith

The bag is ten inches high and eight inches wide and is made of a good quality of heavy pongee silk. The decoration is of tatting worked in Corticelli Crochet and Knitting Silk in color to match the bag. A less expensive bag could be made of linen, with tatting in Corticelli Cordonnet Size 10.

Measure the center of bag below the inch hem, and mark it with a knot of thread. Both sides of bag are alike in decoration.

For center medallion make a 9 p. ring with 2 d. s. between p., then a 9 p. scallop with 2 d. s. between p.'s. Continue with alternate ring and scallop until you have 8 rings and 8 scallops, join.

Make a 7 p. ring with 2 d. s. between each picot, join it to the 5th p. of the scallop of the center medallion at the 4th p. of ring. Make an 8 p. ch. with 2 d. s. between each p., 7 p. ring, then another chain, continue until the center ring is surrounded by 8 points.

Make a 7 p. ring and join to a point at the 4th p. of rings; then a 5 p. scallop with 2 d. s. between p., 4 more rings like the first, not joined together, and 5 scallops like the first. Make a 7 p. ring and join it to the next point of center at the 4th p. of rings. Repeat, finishing medallion. Appliquéd on bag.

The sides and lower end of bag are trimmed with border of double tatting made with spool and shuttle.

Make rings of 11 p. with 2 d. s. between p.'s. With spool and shuttle, make bars of 3 p. with 2 d. s. between, finish with a ring to make a clover leaf. A seven pointed star is placed at each of the lower corners of bag after the double tatting is sewed on.

To make the stars: 1st, make a 9 p. ring with 2 d. s. between p. Ch. with spool and shuttle 5 p. with 2 d. s. between each p., with shuttle make 2 d. s., 1 p., 2 d. s., close. This makes a small point. With spool and shuttle make ch. of 5 p. with 2 d. s. between to make the star point, continue till the 7 points are finished.

The scroll, extending from the star points, is made as follows: R. of 7 p. with 2 d. s. between p., ch. of 5 p. with 2 d. s. between p., rp. until you have 18 rings with 17 chains between.

The lower edge of bag is finished with a tatting fringe made with spool and shuttle: Make an 11 p. ring with 2 d. s. between each p., then a bar of 5 p. with 2 d. s. between each p., 5 p. ring, 5 p. bar, this completes one bar. Continue to the required length.

The upper edge is finished with rings of 7 p. with 2 d. s. between p. and scallops of 6 d. s., 1 p., 6 d. s., rp. At the base of hem is appliquéd the beading. This beading is made in 2 rows with spool and shuttle. Make a 7 p. ring, 6 d. s., R. of 5 p., then 6 d. s., R. of 7 p., a scallop of 12 d. s. with 1 p. in the middle of scallop. Continue as begun, alternating a point, then a scallop. The upper row alternates as the lower but is formed a little differently. The thread is fastened to the 3d p. of the 5 p. ring and a 4 p. scallop is made. Then make a 5 p. ring and join at the 3d p. to the p. of the scallop of the 1st row made. Rp.

Two yards of cord are required for this bag. The ends of the cord are knotted and covered with 4 tatting rings which are sewed on, giving a pretty finish and keeping the knots in place.

This bag is lined with sateen and in the lining a small postage stamp pocket is made and fastened with a small hook, which adds to its desirability.

The tatting is all appliquéd on the bag before it is seamed. The lining is sewed up and fitted in and then the hem is made.

Medallion and Edgings

Exquisite trimmings may be made by combining some of these lovely designs. Medallion No. 131 edged with No. 132 would make a dainty small doily, and for a larger size repeat the border of the medallion to give the required width. Lace Edge No. 134 could be combined with Ribbon Casing No. 161 for a charming yoke for nightgown or camisole. Beautiful decorations, as simple or elaborate as you wish, may be designed for luncheon sets, table scarfs, cushion tops, etc., selecting medallion, insertion and edge of similar pattern.

The designs are worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet. Select a size suitable for the article that you are making. If a silk trimming is desired use Corticelli Crochet and Knitting Silk. These materials come in white, cream, ecru and fast colors.

Edge No. 129

The edge is 1 inch wide when worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30.

Instructions: Use continuous thread. R. 4 d. s., (p., 4 d. s.) 3 times; turn, *ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, j. 2d p. of r., l. p., ch. 2 d. s., p., 3 d. s. Clover leaf, 1st ring: 3 d. s., j. 1st p. of 1st r., (2 d. s., p.) 4 times, 3 d. s.; make 2d and 3d rings like 1st, joining 1st and last p., turn; 3 d. s., join p. of last ch., 2 d. s., j. 1. p., r. 4 d. s., j. 2d p. of last r. of clover leaf, 1 d. s., p., 4 d. s., p., 8 d. s.; repeat from *, joining 2d p. of 1st r. of clover leaf to 2d p. of 2d r.

Edge No. 130

This pattern is $\frac{5}{8}$ of an inch wide worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30.

Instructions: Use continuous thread. L. r., (2 d. s., p.) 6 times, 12 d. s., turn; ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, j. by shuttle thread to last p. of l. r., ch. 3 d. s.; repeat from beginning to desired length.

2d row: Join threads to 1st p. of 1st row, *ch. 6 d. s., p., 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., turn; r. 5 d. s., join 3d p. of same l. r., 3 d. s., turn; ch. 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., p., 6 d. s., join last p. of same l. r., ch. 3 d. s., join 1st p. of next l. r.; repeat from *.

3d row: Join threads to 1st p. of 2d row, *ch. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., join base of r. of last row, ch. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., join 2d p. of next ch., ch. 4 d. s., join 1st p. of next ch.; repeat from *.

Medallion No. 131

The center motif of this medallion may be used by itself, or several motifs may be grouped together for a yoke; or any of the other edges may be added to it. The medallion is 4 inches wide in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30.

Instructions: Use continuous thread. Center Motif: C. r. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, *ch. 2 d. s., join by shuttle thread to 1st p. of c. r., l. d. r., 9 d. s., p., 9 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join p. of r., (p., 2 d. s.) 6 times, join at base of r.; repeat from * 4 times, joining last d. r. at base of c. r., tie and cut threads.

1st row: With continuous thread, s. r., 3 d. s., (p., 3 d. s.) 3 times, turn, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 2 times, join by shuttle thread to 1st p. of s. r., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join 2d p. of s. r., r. 9 d. s., p., 9 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., join 4th p. of last ch., (2 d. s., p.) 4 times, 2 d. s., join p. of l. r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, draw up close, join same p. of l. r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join base of l. r., ch. 2 d. s., join last p. of last ch., (2 d. s., p.) 3 times, join by shuttle thread to 3d p. of s. r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) twice, join at base of same r., turn, ch. 4 d. s., join 1st p. of 2d ch. of center motif (2 d. s., p.) twice, 4 d. s.; repeat from beginning, join last p. of last ch. to last p. of 1st ch. in next d. r., and join last ch. of row at base of 1st s. r.

2d row: *R. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, turn, ch. 3 d. s., p., 3 d. s., turn; repeat from * twice, join the next three rings to the three top picots of 1st row; repeat from beginning, all around.

Edge No. 132

This edge is 1 inch wide in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30.

Instructions: S. r. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., ch. 4 d. s., r. 3 d. s., (p., 3 d. s.) 3 times, *turn; ch. 4 d. s., join p. of s. r., 4 d. s., p., 8 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join p. of last r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, draw up close and join same p., (ch. 2 d. s., p.) 4 times, 2 d. s., ch. 4 d. s., s. r. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., ch. 4 d. s., r. 3 d. s., (p., 3 d. s.) twice, turn; repeat from *.

Edge No. 133


This dainty edge is in pink and white. Worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 40 in White and Size 50 in Pink No. 294 it is about 1 inch wide. Blue No. 213 could be used in place of the pink.

Instructions: Fill one shuttle with pink and another with white; tie ends together. Pink. L.r., 4 d. s., p., 2 d. s., p., 4 d. s., p., 10 d. s., wind white thread around finger, *ch. 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., change shuttle. Clover leaf, 1st ring: 2 d. s., join last p. of ch., (2 d. s., p.) 4 times; 2d ring: 2 d. s., join 1st r., (2 d. s., p.) 4 times. Make 3d ring like 2d, ch. 2 d. s., join last p. of clover leaf, 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., join last p. of 1st l. r., being careful to keep chain and clover leaf on the side of l. r. that has no picots, l. p., ch. 2 d. s., p., 5 d. s., turn. With pink thread make clover leaf the same as before, joining 2d p. of 1st r. to last p. of l. r., turn; change shuttles, ch. 5 d. s., join p. of last ch., 2 d. s., join l. p., l. r., 4 d. s., join 4th p. of last r. of clover leaf, 2 d. s., p., 4 d. s., p., 10 d. s., turn; repeat from *.

Lace Edge No. 134

This edge is beautiful for a centerpiece or could be effectively used with pattern No. 152 for table scarf, luncheon cloth or pillow top. It would make a charming yoke for camisole or chemise. In Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 20 it is $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide.

For instructions use the first two rows of pattern No. 152.



From the top. *1st row.* Design to the left, Edge No. 129. Design to the right, Edge No. 130.

2d row. Round Medallion No. 131.

3d row. Design to the left, Edge No. 132. Design to the right, Edge No. 133.

4th row. Lace Edge No. 134.

Medallions and Lace

Medallion No. 135

This pattern may be used as a single motif or several of the medallions may be joined and used effectively as an appliquéd edge for centerpiece, or as an insertion. It is suitable for appliquéd on net and may be used with Edge No. 132 or Insertion No. 129. In Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 it is $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.

Instructions: Use continuous thread between shuttle and ball. Center r. (3 d. s., p.) 4 times; ch. 3 d. s., join by shuttle thread to 1st p. of center r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, turn; large d. r., 10 d. s., join in same p. of center r., 10 d. s., turn; s. r., 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join same p. of center r.; this makes a double r., ch. 3 d. s., join next p. of center r.; repeat d. r., continue till there are 5 d. r.'s, joining the last one at the base of center r., and joining d. r. by 1st and last p. of chs., tie threads and cut.

1st row around: Join threads to 3d p. of 1st ch., *ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join p. of s. r., (p., 2 d. s.) 6 times, join 3d p. of 2d ch., ch. 1 d. s., 1 d. s., join 3d p. of next ch.; repeat from * all around, join last small ch. to same p. of 1st ch.

2d row: (ch. 3 d. s., p., 3 d. s., miss 1st p. of 1st row, join the next) 4 times, ch. 3 d. s., p., 3 d. s., join p. of small ch.; repeat all around. Tie and cut threads.

Medallion No. 136

This medallion may be used with Edge No. 153 or No. 154 and is suitable for decorating lingerie or table linen. In Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 it is $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.

Instructions: Use continuous thread between two shuttles. Center r., (2 d. s., p.) 6 times, 2 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., join by shuttle thread to 1st p. of center r., *ch. 3 d. s., l. p., 3 d. s., l. r., 10 d. s., p., 10 d. s., around this l. r. Ch. 4 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join p. of l. r., change shuttles; clover leaf, r. 3 d. s., join last p. of last ch., (2 d. s., p.) 6 times, 3 d. s., make 2d and 3d rings of clover leaf the same, joining 1st p. to last p. of previous r.. Draw loop of thread through between 1st r. of clover leaf and last ch., pass shuttle through and draw up closely; change shuttles, ch. 2 d. s., join last p. of clover leaf, (2 d. s., p.) 3 times, 4 d. s., join at base of l. r., ch. 3 d. s., l. p., 3 d. s., join same p. of center r., ch. 3 d. s., join next p. of center r.; repeat from *, joining as shown in illustration.

Square Medallion No. 137

Worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 this medallion measures $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches from point to point.

Instructions: Center r., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, tie threads, then tie again far enough from r. to make another r., p., and cut.

Center Motif: With continuous thread, r. 5 d. s., p., 5 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., join 1st p. of center r., 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., r. 10 d. s., p., 10 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join p. of r., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join base of r., ch. 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., join by ball thread to next p. of center r., 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s.; repeat from beginning 3 times, join threads at base of 1st r., tie and cut threads.

1st row around: Begin with s. r., 5 d. s., join p. of 1st s. r. of center motif, 5 d. s., turn; large r., 4 d. s., (p., 4 d. s.) 3 times, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join last p. of 1st ch. of large d. r. of center motif; reverse, ch. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., clover leaf, s. r., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, ch. 2 d. s., join by shuttle thread to 1st p. of s. r.; large d. r., ch. 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., join last p. of 1st ch., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, turn, r. 10 d. s., join same p. of s. r., 10 d. s., turn; s. r., 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., join last p. of l. r., 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join same p. of s. r., ch. 2 d. s., join next p. of s. r., repeat from * twice, omitting to join 2d p. of s. r. at top of large d. r.; reverse, ch. 4 d. s., join p. of opposite ch., 4 d. s., join next p. of 1st large d. r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times; repeat from beginning 3 times.

Medallion No. 138

Coronation braid is used for the center of this dainty daisy pattern. The medallion could be used as an inset on doilies similar to pattern No. 89. A centerpiece with an appliquéd edge of medallions would be beautiful. Worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 it is $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.

Instructions: Count off 16 knots of cord, cut and fasten with needle and thread as shown.


With continuous thread between shuttle and ball, join around stem between 1st two knots, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 6 times, join around next stem; repeat all around, joining last ch. where 1st ch. started; sl. st. to 1st p. of ch., *t. c. of 3 sets of 4-4, turn; r. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) twice, join 3d p. of 1st ch., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) twice, turn; t. c. as before, r. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) twice, join 4th p. of same ch., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) twice, turn; t. c., join 6th p. of same ch., ch. 2 d. s., join 1st p. of next ch.; repeat from * 7 times, tie and cut threads.

Medallion No. 139

Worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 this medallion is $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter.

Instructions: Center r., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 11 times, tie threads, then tie again to make 12th p. Ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, increasing the length of the 1st, 3d and 5th picots and making 2d and 4th picots the usual size. R. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 9 times, ch. like 1st ch., except that the 1st p. is long and the 3d and 5th are decreased in length, join next p. of center r., ch. like 1st ch., joining 1st, 3d and 5th picots to corresponding picots in last ch.; repeat until there are 12 rings around, join last ch. where 1st one started, tie and cut threads.

With continuous thread, join 2d p. of 1st r., *ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 9 times, join 8th p. of same r., ch. 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., join 2d p. of next r., repeat from * 11 times; join last ch. where 1st one started, tie and cut threads.



All Over Lace No. 140

This lace is a beautiful and unusual all over pattern. It may be made any width and used as dress trimming, for collar and cuffs, or as insertion, or it may be shaped into yokes. It could be fashioned into a dainty baby cap, using Medallion No. 131 for the back.

Instructions: R. 8 d. s., p., 8 d. s., ch. 7 d. s., p., 3 d. s., join by shuttle thread to p. of ring, 3 d. s., p., 7 d. s., join at base of r., turn; ch. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., p., 2 d. s., p., 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s.; r. 8 d. s., p., 8 d. s., ch. 7 d. s., join p. of last ch. of 1st d. r., 3 d. s., join p. of last r., 3 d. s., p., 7 d. s., join base of last r.; opposite 2d d. r. make a 3d d. r.; then repeat chains and d.r.'s, until there are 6 pairs of d. r.'s, ch. as before, then make one d. r., 1 ch., 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., p., 2 d. s., p., 4 d. s., p., 2 d. s., p., 4 d. s., turn; work another row back to the beginning. Make 1st two d. r.'s with ch. between and join the last d.r. to the 1st one and also to the last two d.r.'s of the 1st row. Turn, opposite last r. make another d. r., then ch. as before, joining middle two picots to corresponding two picots in 1st row, continue to end of row, joining d. r.'s in groups of four, turn; 1 ch., 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., p., 2 d. s., p., 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., turn; make 3d row across like 1st row, and 4th row like 2d.

Medallion No. 141

This medallion, worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 50, will measure about $3\frac{3}{4}$ inches in diameter. A beautiful lace centerpiece could be made by using the medallion for the center and working around it three rows of edging, pattern No. 86d, then a row of the medallions and three more rows of the edging, finishing with an edge of the medallions. The medallion is also suitable for trimming dresses or underwear.

Instructions: Make center motif the same as for Medallion No. 143. *R. 10 d. s., p., 10 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times.

1st row: L. r., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 11 times, turn; ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join 4th p. of 1st ch. of center motif (c. m.), 2 d. s., join 5th p. of same ch., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, 2 d. s., repeat 1st R., turn; ch. 4 d. s., join last p. of last ch., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, join 1st p. of next ch. of c. m., 2 d. s., join next p., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 6 times; repeat from beginning 4 times.

2d row: With one thread only, s. r., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, join thread to 3d p. of R. of 1st row, R. 2 d. s., join last p. of 1st R., (2 d. s., p.) 4 times, 2 d. s., join thread to next p. of same R., R. 2 d. s., join last p. of last R., (2 d. s., p.) 5 times, 2 d. s., join thread to next p. of same R., R. 2 d. s., join last p. of last R., (2 d. s., p.) 7 times, 2 d. s., join next p. of same R., make 5th R. like 3d, 6th R. like 2d, and 7th R. like 1st, join thread to 9th p., leave $\frac{1}{8}$ inch of thread, turn; R. 8 d. s., join around ch. of 1st R. where it joins 1st p. of c. m., 8 d. s., leave same length of thread, repeat 7 rings around next large R. in making next R., join it around over 2d p. of 2d ch. of 1st row; repeat from beginning 4 times.


Medallion No. 142

The medallion is $3\frac{1}{4}$ inches in diameter worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30. A dainty baby cap may be made of net or fine lawn with the medallion for the back and an edge of pattern No. 20 or 46. Worked in ecru cordonnet this medallion would be an effective trimming for library scarf or cushion.

Use continuous thread. *1st row:* C. r., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, ch. 5 d. s., p., 5 d. s., s. r., 5 d. s., p., 5 d. s., *ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, turn; R. 10 d. s., join base of s. r., 10 d. s., turn; ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join same place, s. r., 5 d. s., p., 5 d. s., turn; ch. 5 d. s., join p. of 1st ch., 5 d. s., join 1st p. of c. r., ch. 5 d. s., p., 5 d. s., s. r., 5 d. s., join last s. r. of 5 d. s.; repeat from * until there are 6 points; join last ch. where 1st ch. started at base of c. r., tie and cut threads.

2d row: Join thread to top of l. d. r., *ch. 5 d. s., turn; R. 5 d. s., p., 5 d. s., turn; ch. 5 d. s., miss 1 p. of l. d. r., join next, ch. 5 d. s., turn; R. 5 d. s., p., 5 d. s., turn, ch. 5 d. s., join 4th p. of 1st ch. of next l. d. r., 5 d. s., turn; R. 5 d. s., p., 5 d. s., turn; ch. 5 d. s., join top of same l.d.r.; repeat from * all around; after last R., ch. 5 d. s., join top of l. d. r. where 2d row started, tie and cut threads.

3d row: Join threads to p. of R. of 2d row, ch. 6 d. s., p., 6 d. s., join p. of next R.; repeat all around, tie and cut threads.

Medallion No. 143

Developed in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 the medallion is 3 inches in diameter. By repeating the center motif at the end of the instructions and continuing the design for another medallion, etc., a band of medallions may be made which could be effectively used as insertion for a square hem-stitched centerpiece, or a square lace centerpiece may be made by joining several medallions in this way.

Instructions: Center motif: C. r., 3 d. s., (p., 3 d. s.) 3 times, *ch., 5 d. s., R. 8 d. s., p., 8 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join p. of R., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join base of R.; ch. 5 d. s., join 1st p. of c. r., turn; repeat from * 3 times, joining last ch. at base of c. r., tie and cut threads. 2d row: Ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join same p. of c. r., ch. 2 d. s., join next p. of c. r., make l. d. r., ch. 2 d. s., join next p. of c. r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join top of next d. r.; this finishes the 8th 4 r. m.; over s. ch., ch. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., join next 4 r. m., and continue finishing all 4 r. m.'s the same.


Medallion No. 144

This medallion measures 2½ inches in diameter worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 50. For a charming boudoir cap of net use the medallion for the center and edge of pattern No. 166 worked in one color. A pretty baby cap could be made in a similar way, using the medallion for the back. This design is also pretty for trimming waists or underwear.

Instructions: Center Motif: R. 4 d. s., p., (5 d. s., p.) twice, 4 d. s.; work 4 of these rings close together, tie and cut threads.

2d row: With continuous thread, join 1st p. of 1st R., * ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, join 2d p. of same R., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, join 3d p. of same R., and also 1st p. of next R.; repeat from * 3 times, fasten thread where ch. began, tie and cut.

3d row: With continuous thread, R. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., join last p. of 1st ch. of center motif, 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., * ch. 6 d. s., p., 5 d. s.; clover leaf, each R. 4 d. s., (p., 4 d. s.) 3 times, join 2d and 3d rings by 1st p. to last p. of previous R., turn; ch. 5 d. s., p., 6 d. s., turn; R. 4 d. s., join last p. of 1st R., 4 d. s., join 1st p. of 2d ch. of center motif, 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., turn; ch. 6 d. s., join top p. of last R. of clover leaf, 5 d. s.; repeat clover leaf and ch., R. 3 d. s., join last p. of 2d R., 4 d. s., (p., 4 d. s.) twice, turn; repeat from * all around, making 12 clover leaves.



From the top. *1st row*, Insertion No. 145; *2d row*, Lace Insertion No. 146; *3d row*, Wide Insertion No. 147.

Insertion No. 145

A dainty dresser scarf can be made of ecru marquisette, hemstitched, with a band of this insertion about two inches inside the hem, and with corner motifs of Medallion No. 135. A little embroidery will add to the effect. A pincushion to match can have a hemstitched cover with a strip of the insertion lengthwise across the top and a medallion at each end. The hem of the scarf will be about one and one-fourth inches and that of the cushion three-fourths of an inch wide. Pretty curtains can be made of the marquisette hemstitched and with the corners decorated with the insertion and medallion. The tatting should be in ecru Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 50. The insertion is also suitable for underwear used with Edge No. 132. In Size 30 cotton it is $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide.

Instructions: Use continuous thread. S. r. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., ch. 4 d. s., R. 8 d. s., p., 8 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join p. of last r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, draw up close, join same p., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join base of l. d. r., * ch. 5 d. s., p., 8 d. s., turn; R. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., reverse; ch. 4 d. s., l. d. r., repeat from *, joining s. r. to p. of 1st ch. and 3d l. d. r. to 1st and 4th to 2d.

Lace Insertion No. 146

A beautiful yoke for corset cover or nightgown may easily be designed from this pattern. For the straps over the shoulders use a double row of the lower edge of the insertion. The lower edge may also be used by itself as a dainty insertion for towels, and the upper or flower part can be used with beautiful effect in a dresser scarf or centerpiece. It would be lovely on net for a dainty bedroom set. The lower edge may be repeated on the opposite side of the flower design for a wider insertion, or the flower border itself may be repeated to give the desired width. In Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 the design is $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches wide.

Instructions: Heading. *1st row:* Use continuous thread between shuttle and ball. R. 8 d. s., l. p., 8 d. s., turn; ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, turn; repeat from beginning twice, join each R. to l. p. of 1st R., * ch. 4 d. s., R. 8 d. s., p., 8 d. s., turn; ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, R. 8 d. s., join p. of last R., 8 d. s., repeat from * to required length. *2d row:* Ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, turn, * R. 8 d. s., join with last two rings of 1st row, 8 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, R. 8 d. s., join with last R., 8 d. s., turn, 4 d. s., repeat from *.

Edge. *1st row:* With continuous thread. L. r., 12 d. s., p., 12 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 6 times, join p. of l. r., ch. 9 d. s., repeat for desired length, turn; ch. 9 d. s., join p. of last l. r., and complete large d. r. by making ch. of 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 6 times, join at base of l. r., ch. 9 d. s., join p. of next l. d. r. and continue entire length.

2d row: S. r. 4 d. s., join 1st p. of l. d. r., 4 d. s., turn; ch. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., turn; R. 5 d. s., join 2d p. of l. d. r., 5 d. s., turn; ch. 4 d. s., join 4th p. of ch. of heading, 4 d. s., turn; R. 6 d. s., join 3d p. of l. d. r., 6 d. s., turn; ch. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., turn; R. 6 d. s., join 4th p. of l. d. r., 6 d. s., turn; 4 d. s., join 4th p. of next ch. of heading, 4 d. s., R. 5 d. s., join 5th p. of l. d. r., 5 d. s., turn; ch. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., turn; R. 4 d. s., join 6th p. of l. d. r., 4 d. s., turn; ch. 5 d. s., miss 1 p. of next l. d. r., join the next 4 p. all together, ch. 4 d. s., and repeat.

3d row: Like 2d row, omitting joining to heading.

Wide Insertion No. 147

This insertion matches Edge No. 134 and Medallion No. 155 and the three patterns may be effectively combined. The design is suitable for bedspreads, scarfs, cushion covers, etc. It can be used on net with good effect. In Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 20 the insertion is $3\frac{1}{4}$ inches wide.

Instructions: Two shuttles with continuous thread between.

1st row: S. r. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., turn; ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, R. 5 d. s., (p., 5 d. s.) 4 times, turn; ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, s. r. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., reverse; ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, join last p. of 1st R., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, turn; (l. r., 10 d. s., p., 10 d. s.) twice, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, change shuttles*, clover leaf, 2 d. s., join last p. of ch., (2 d. s., p.) 3 times, 2 d. s., repeat from * 3 times, change shuttles, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, turn; l. r., 10 d. s., join p. of last l. r., 10 d. s., l. r., 10 d. s., join 1st l. r., 10 d. s., turn; ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, s. r. 4 d. s., join last s. r., 4 d. s., reverse, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, turn; R. 5 d. s., join 4th p. of next to last ch., (5 d. s., p.) twice, 5 d. s., turn, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times; repeat from beginning.

2d row: With continuous thread, join 4th p. of 1st ch. of 1st row, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, join 4th p. of next ch., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, s. r. 5 d. s., join 2 s. r.'s of 1st row, 5 d. s.; repeat from beginning.

Make two pieces of required length, join them with center row, c. r., (1 d. s., l. p.) 11 times, 1 d. s., tie threads, then tie again, making 12th l. p.

Row around center ring: S. r. 3 d. s., join 1st l. p., 3 d. s., join thread to 2d p. of clover leaf, s. r. 3 d. s., join 2d l. p., 3 d. s., join thread to 4th p. of ch. next to clover leaf, s. r. 3 d. s., join 3d l. p., 3 d. s., join thread to R. between points, s. r. 3 d. s., join 4th l. p., 3 d. s., join thread to 4th p. of 2d point, s. r. 3 d. s., join next l. p., 3 d. s., join thread to 1st p. of next clover leaf, s. r. 3 d. s., join next l. p., 3 d. s., join 1st p. of next R. of clover leaf and also p. of opposite R. of clover leaf in 2d row, 3 d. s., continue around c. r., joining to 2d piece in the same manner as was joined to 1st piece.

Square Medallion No. 148

Several medallions may be joined to form a band to be used as an edge or insertion for table scarf or tea cloth. In smaller pieces the medallion may be used singly. Groups of medallions may be used to decorate curtains. When worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 the design is 2 inches square.

Instructions: Use continuous thread. C. r. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, *t. c. 4 sets of 4-4 sts.,** s. r. 3 d. s., (p., 3 d. s.) 3 times, ch. 3 d. s., join by shuttle thread to 1st p. of s. r., l. d. r., R. 10 d. s., p., 10 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join p. of l. r., ch. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., draw up closely and join same p., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join base of l. r.; repeat from ** twice, ch. 3 d. s., join base of s. r., t. c. 4 sets of 4-4 sts., join next p. of c. r., t. c. of 3 sets of 4-4 sts., s. r. 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., t. c. of 3 sets of 4-4 sts., join next p. of c. r.; repeat from 1st * 3 times.

Medallion No. 149

This medallion is charming combined with embroidery and used as a corner motif for luncheon sets or for trimming underwear. It may be used with Edge No. 132. Worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 it is 2 $\frac{3}{8}$ inches square.

R. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, tie and then tie again to make the 8th picot, and cut the thread.

Three-cornered Motif: R. 3 d. s., (p., 3 d. s.) 3 times, ch. 3 d. s., join p. of center ring, 3 d. s., join 1st p. of last R., ch. 3 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, turn; *R. 3 d. s., join to next p. of R., 3 d. s., turn; R. 9 d. s., p., 9 d. s., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join p. of l. r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, draw up close, join same p., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join base of l. r., *ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, repeat from * to *, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, join base of 1st R., tie and cut. Make 3 more of these motifs joining them to center ring and to each other as shown.

Round Medallion No. 150

This medallion matches Edge No. 134 and Insertion No. 147. A dainty bedspread can be made of net with Insertion No. 147, Corner Medallions No. 150 and Edge No. 134. Many ways for combining these three patterns will suggest themselves. The illustration shows the actual size of the medallion in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 20.

Instructions: *1st row:* Work the same as first row in Insertion No. 147, the small rings not joined. *2d row:* Join threads to 4th p. of 1st ch., ch. 3 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 6 times, p., 3 d. s., turn; R. 6 d. s., join p. of s. r. of 1st row, 6 d. s., repeat R., join to next s. r., ch. 3 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 6 times, p., 3 d. s., join 4th p. of next ch. of 1st row, ch. 3 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 6 times, p., 3 d. s., join 4th p. of next ch.; repeat from beginning all around.

Insertion or Beading No. 151



R. 4 d.s., (p., 4 d.s.) 3 times, turn; ch. 3 d.s., (p., 3 d.s.) 5 times, join 2d p. of R., repeat ch. and R., join R. by 2d p. to 2d p. of 1st R., reverse; ch. 2 d.s., p., 3 d.s.; change shuttles, clover leaf, R. 3 d.s., join p. of last ch., 3 d.s., (p., 1 d.s.) twice, (p., 3 d.s.) twice; make 2d and 3d rings of clover leaf the same, joining 1st and last picots; change shuttles, ch. 3 d.s., join last p. of R., 2 d.s., repeat from beginning.

Insertion No. 155

This design may be used as an insertion or beading for trimming underwear or children's dresses, or as an insertion in towels. When worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 50 it is about $\frac{1}{8}$ of an inch wide.

Instructions: Use continuous thread between two shuttles. *1st row:* S. r., 2 d.s., (p., 2 d.s.) 3 times, turn; ch. 4 d.s., p., 12 d.s., s. r., 2 d.s., (p., 2 d.s.) 3 times, reverse; ch. 3 d.s., (p., 3 d.s.) twice; **change shuttles; *s. r., 2 d.s., (p., 2 d.s.) 3 times, change shuttles, ch. 4 d.s., * repeat from * to * 3 times; s. r., 4 d.s., join p. of 1st ch., 4 d.s., reverse; ch. 3 d.s., (p., 3 d.s.) 3 times, 12 d.s., join p. of 3d s. r., reverse; ch. 3 d.s., (p., 3 d.s.) twice; repeat from ** for required length.

2d row: Join threads to 1st p. of 1st row, ch. 3 d.s., join next p., ch. 2 d.s., (p., 2 d.s.) 5 times, join next p.; repeat entire length. *3d row:* Like 2d row made on opposite side of 1st row.

Beading No. 156

This is a dainty trimming for underwear or children's dresses. For infants' wear it should be developed in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 70. When worked in Size 30 Cordonnet it measures about $\frac{1}{8}$ of an inch wide.

Instructions: Use continuous thread.



Edge No. 157

Coronation cord is used with tatting to make this beautiful edge for a centerpiece. Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 50 will make an edge about 2 inches wide.

Instructions: Double four knots of cord to form opposite loops, join thread around stems (thin place between knots). T. c. 2 sets of 4-4 sts., p., 2 sets of 4-4 sts.; let this t. c. lay alongside of 5th knot, then join next 4 knots in same way as 1st 4 knots, drawing thread closely; repeat for desired length.

1st row: On upper side of coronation cord. Join threads to stem at top of 1st upper loop, t. c. 3 sets of 4-4 sts., turn; R. 2 d.s., (p., 2 d.s.) 3 times, join p. of 1st row of t. c., 2 d.s., (p., 2 d.s.) 3 times, turn; t. c. 3 sets 4-4 sts., join stem at top of next loop; repeat for entire length.



Edge No. 157

2d row: Join threads at top of 1st loop, *R. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 7 times, t. c. 4 sets of 4-4 sts. (or less if edge is wanted curved), join top of next loop; repeat from *.

Worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 the motif is about 1½ inches square and may be effectively used in a set of tea cloth and napkins similar to design No. 111.

C. r., 3 d. s., (p., 3 d. s.) 7 times, *ch. 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., turn; s. r., 4 d. s., p., 4 d. s., turn; ch. 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., l. d. r., r. 10 d. s., p., 10 d. s., turn; ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join p. of last r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, draw up closely and join same p., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 5 times, join at base of large r., ch. 2 d. s., p., 2 d. s., join next p. of c. r.; repeat from * 3 times, join last ch. where first one started, tie and cut.

Medallion No. 159

Worked in Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 30 the medallion is about 2 inches in diameter.

Instructions: Begin in center of double ring clover leaf. S. r., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 3 times, s. ch., 2 d. s., join by shuttle thread to 1st p. of s. r., 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, turn, l. r., 8 d. s., join same p. of s. r., 8 d. s., turn, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join same p., s. ch., 2 d. s., join next p. of s. r., ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, turn, r. 8 d. s., join same p., 8 d. s. Now make center ring of medallion, 3 d. s., (p., 3 d. s.) 3 times, draw up and loop thread around at base to hold it in good shape, then finish l. d. r. of clover leaf, ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 4 times, join same p. of 1st s. r., s. ch., 2 d. s., join 3d p. of s. r., make 3d l. d. r., s. ch., 2 d. s., join at base of s. r.; this completes double ring clover leaf. Ch. 2 d. s., (p., 2 d. s.) 9 times (this is the long ch. on outside of medallion), join at top of last d. r. of clover leaf, repeat long ch., then make 2d double ring clover leaf and join 1st d. r. to top of last d. r. of 1st clover leaf (same place where 1st long ch. was joined), join 2d d. r. to 1st p. of c. r., finish clover leaf and make two more, joining top of middle d. r. of each to remaining two picots of c. r., join last long ch. at base of 1st s. r.



The tatted hat band is sewed on to a foundation of black velvet ribbon $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide and long enough to encircle the hat. The tatting is worked in Corticelli Crochet and Knitting Silk in any color desired. Patterns No. 38 or 57 could be used for hat bands in this way.

Instructions: Commence with a ring of 9 p. with 2 d. s. between each p. With spool and shuttle make a scallop of 9 p.'s with 2 d. s. between each, and another ring joined to the 1st at the 4th p. Continue scallops and rings till 6 rings and 5 scallops are made; join the sixth r. to the first, thus forming a circle of rings. The next figure is like the first and joined by the 4th and 6th p. of the 3d scallop to 1st p. of the rings in the first medallion.



Tatted Initials No. 170.

Lacy tatted initials are not difficult to make and may be used to decorate linen in the same way as embroidered or crocheted letters. Baste the initials to the linen and buttonhole all around, then cut away the cloth under the letter. On net they should be appliquéd. Any letter can be made in this pattern. In Corticelli Mercerized Cordonnet Size 50 the letters are about $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches high.




