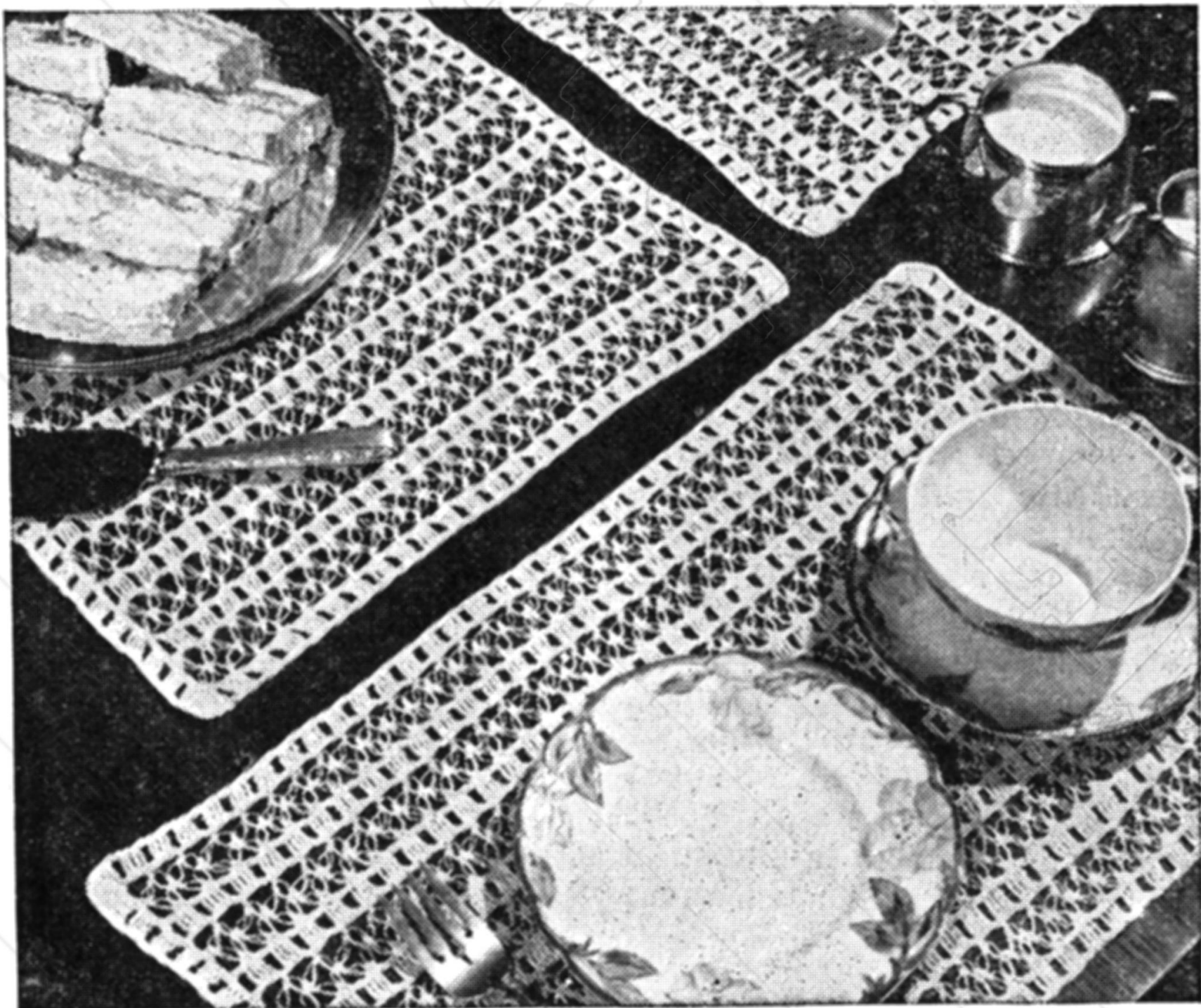

LUNCHEON SET (Shown on Front Cover)

This Luncheon Set of two place mats and a runner, made in knot stitch and treble crochet, requires about 6 large balls of J. & P. Coats or Clark's O. N. T. Best Six Cord Mercerized Crochet cotton of white or ecru. Use a steel crochet hook No. 9. The runner measures approximately 12 x 32 inches; each place mat about 11 x 17 inches.

PLACE MAT (Make 2): Make a ch (chain) 18 inches long (13 ch stitches to 1 inch); turn. Row 1: Sc (single crochet) in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across until there are 207 sc on row. Cut off remaining chain; ch 6, turn. Row 2: * Sk (skip) 2 sc, tr (treble) in next 4 sc, ch 2. Repeat from * across, ending with ch 2, sk 2 sc, tr in last sc; ch 1, turn.

Row 3: Sc in tr, * 2 sc in sp (space), sc in next 4 tr. Repeat from * across, ending with 2 sc in ch 6 loop (207 sc); turn. Row 4: (Make a knot st [stitch]—to make a knot st, draw loop on hook up $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, thread over and draw through loop, insert hook between double loop and single thread and make a sc—make another knot st, sk 6 sc, sc in next sc) 3 times; * 2 knot st, sk 5 sc, sc in next sc. Repeat from * across. Make a knot st 1 inch long to turn.

Row 5: 1 knot st ($\frac{1}{2}$ inch long), * sc in each side of center knot of double knot st, 2 knot st. Repeat from * across. Ch 9, turn. Row 6: (Sc on each side of center knot on next double knot st, ch 4) 29 times;

(ch 5, sc on each side of center knot on next double knot st) 3 times. Turn. Row 7: (Sc in next 2 sc, 5 sc under ch 5) 3 times; * sc in next 2 sc, 4 sc under ch 4. Repeat from * across (207 sc).

Repeat 2nd to 7th rows inclusive until piece measures 11 inches, ending with the 3rd row. Break off.

EDGING: With right side facing, attach thread in 3rd row on short side. Row 1: Sc in place where thread was attached and work sc closely together to corresponding position at opposite end of this short side, having a multiple of 6 plus 2 sts. Ch 4, sl st (slip stitch) in top of turning chain of last row of Place Mat. Turn. Row 2: 6 tr in next sc, * tr in next 4 sc, ch 2, sk 2 sc. Repeat from * across, ending with 6 tr in last sc, sl st in last sc of sc row on Place Mat. Turn. Row 3: Sc in next 6 tr, * 2 sc under ch 2, sc in next 4 tr. Repeat from * across. Sl st in first sc of sc row on Place Mat. Break off. Work other short side to correspond.

RUNNER: Make a chain 13 inches long (13 ch stitches to 1 inch). Turn. Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across until there are 147 sc on row. Cut off remaining chain. Ch 6, turn. 2nd to 7th rows inclusive: Work as for Place Mat. Repeat 2nd to 7th rows inclusive until piece measures 32 inches or desired length. Break off. Complete as for Place Mat.

CHILD'S MUFF AND BEANIE

Crochet this attractive muff and beanie set in Chadwick's Red Heart Wool Floss, using a bone crochet hook, No. 5. The set requires about 5 balls (1 oz. balls) each of Cherry Red and Blue Smoke, or other desired colors, and you will also need a muff foundation, 10 inches long, or material for lining and interlining.

This muff and beanie set is made

in single crochet and double crochet, and the two colors are worked one over the other in a colorful way that looks intricate, but is really easy to make.

MUFF: The gauge is 6 sc (single crochet) make 1 inch; 3 clusters make 2 inches. Starting at one end with blue, ch (chain) 72. Join with sl st (slip stitch) to form ring. Rnd



(round) 1: Sc in same place where sl st was made and in each remaining ch around (72 sc). Sc in each sc around for 5 rnds. At the end of the 6th rnd, drop blue, attach cherry and sl st in next sc. (To prevent the two colors from tangling, keep cherry strand on inside of work and blue on outside.)

Rnd 7: With cherry, ch 3; holding back on hook the last loop of each dc (double crochet), make 2 dc in same place where sl st was made, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made); * ch 1; sk (skip) next sc; holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make 3 dc in next sc (another cluster made). Repeat from * around, ending with ch 1, sl st in top of first cluster. Drop cherry, pick up blue; turn.

Rnd 8: With blue, ch 1, sc in same place where sl st was made; insert

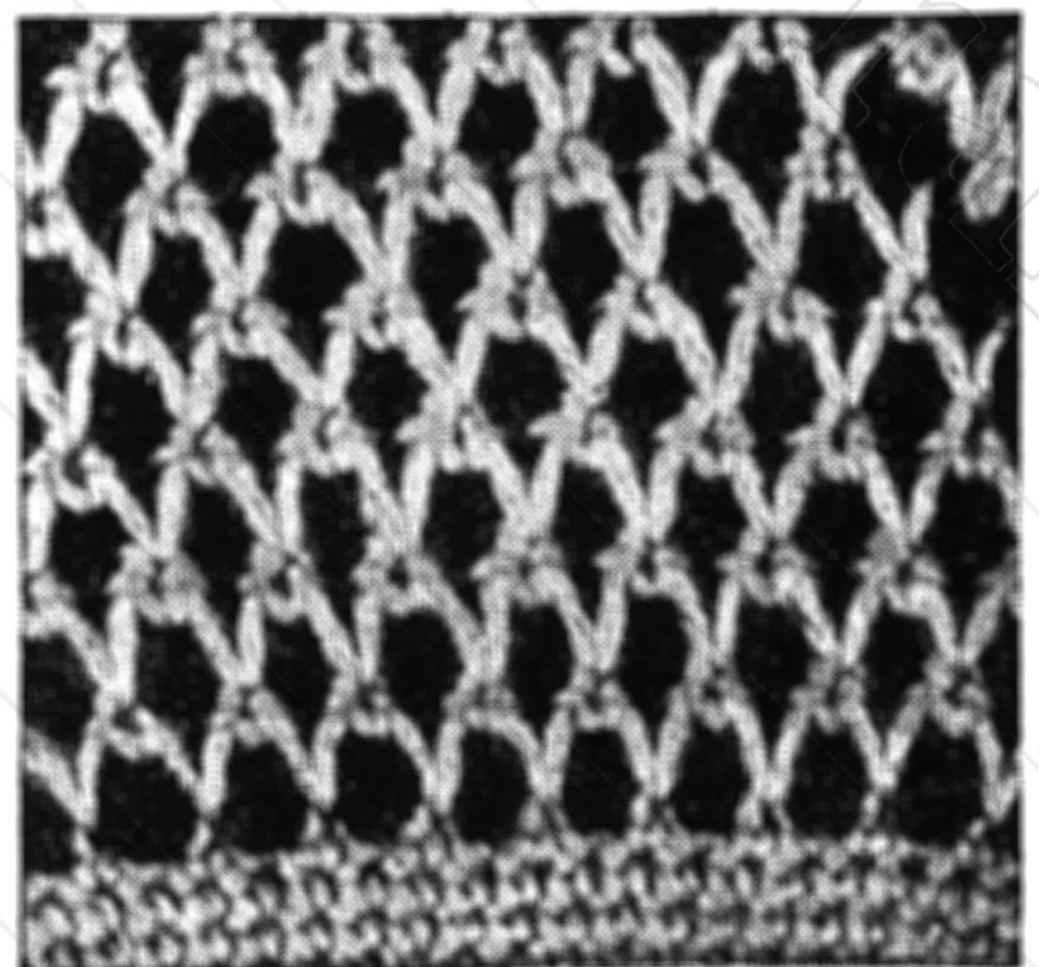
hook in skipped sc of last sc rnd and pull up a loop long enough to reach top of cluster, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook (a long sc made); * sc in top of next cluster, make a long sc in next skipped sc. Repeat from * around, ending with sl st in first sc made. Drop blue, pick up cherry; turn.

Rnd 9: With cherry, sl st in next long sc, ch 3; holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make 2 dc in same long sc, complete cluster; * ch 1, sk next sc, make a cluster in next long sc. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 1, sk last sc, sl st in top of first cluster. Drop cherry, pick up blue; turn.

Repeat 8th and 9th rnd alternately until piece measures 10 inches from beginning; of cluster section, ending with 8th rnd. Break off cherry. Next rnd: With right side facing and using blue, sc in each sc and in each long sc around. Repeat rnd 2, five more times. Break off.

Make a hem at each end of muff by folding back one half of sc band and sewing in place on wrong side. Sew muff over foundation, or line and interline.

BEANIE: Starting at center top of crown with blue, ch 2. Rnd 1: 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around (16 sc). Rnd 3: Sc in each sc around. Rnd 4: 2 sc in each sc around (32 sc). Rnd 5 and 6:



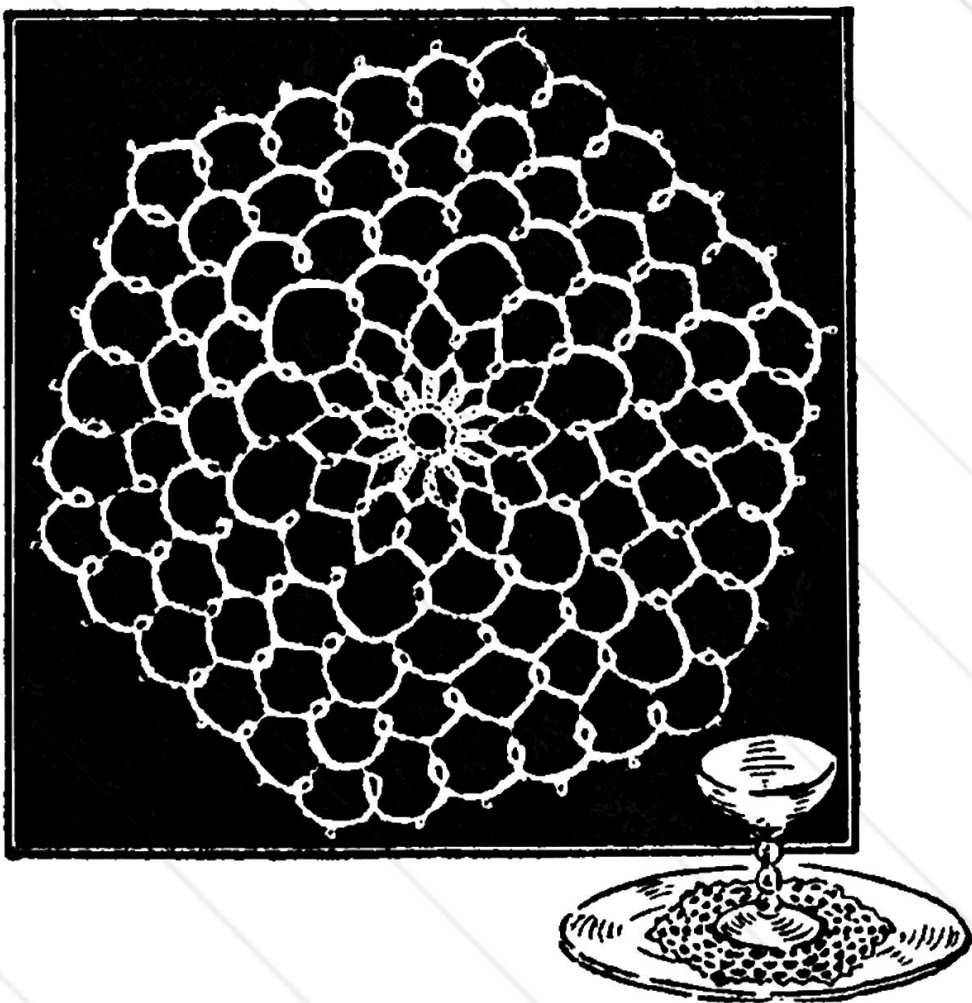
Sc in each sc around. Rnd 7: 2 sc in each sc around (64 sc). Rnd 8 to 12: Sc in each sc around. At end of 12th rnd, drop blue, attach cherry, sl st in next sc.

Rnd 13: Ch 3, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make 2 dc in same place where sl st was made, yarn over and draw through all loops on hook (a cluster made); * ch 1, sk next sc; holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make 3 dc in next sc (another cluster made). Repeat from * around, ending with ch 1, sk last sc, sl st in top of first cluster made. Drop cherry, pick up blue; turn.

Rnd 14: Ch 1, sc in same place where sl st was made, insert hook in skipped sc of last sc rnd, yarn over

and pull up a loop long enough to reach to top of cluster, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook (a long sc made); * sc in top of next cluster, make a long sc in next skipped sc. Repeat from * around, ending with sl st in first sc made. Drop blue, pick up cherry; turn. Rnd 15: Sl st in next long sc, ch 3; holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make 2 dc in same long sc, complete cluster; * ch 1, sk next sc, make a cluster in next long sc. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 1, sk last sc, sl st in top of first cluster. Drop cherry, pick up blue; turn.

Rnd 16 to 24: Repeat rnd 14 and 15 alternately. Rnd 25: Using blue, sc in each sc and in each long sc around. Break off.



HEXAGON TATTED DOILY

Here is a doily that can be made any size by repeating as many rounds as desired. The smaller sizes, 3½ to 4 inches across, are just right for use as doilies under sherbets or goblets. Make it of size 50 mercerized crochet cotton, in white or colors. using a ball and shuttle. The original was of variegated green thread.

Make a r (ring) on shuttle thread of 2 d (double stitch), 12 p (picot) separated by 2 d, 2 d, cl r (close ring). Tie and cut. Rnd (round)

2: R of 3 d, join to p of last r, 3 d, cl r. Attach ball thread, rw (reverse work), ch (chain) 2 d, p, 2 d. Continue around with small rings and chains, joining p of r to p of first r until every p of first r is filled. Tie and cut.

Rnd 3: R of 3 d, join to p of ch in last rnd, 3 d, cl r. Attach ball thread, rw, ch 4 d, p, 4 d. Continue around as before. Rnd 4: * R of 3 d, join to p of last r, 3 d, cl r. Rw. Ch on ball thread 4 d, p, 4 d, p, 4 d, rw, r of 3 d, join to p of last r, 3 d, cl r. Ch of 4 d, p, 4 d. Continue from * around, alternating long ch and short ch. Tie and cut. Rnd 5: Same as rnd 4 with long ch falling over long ch of last rnd always. Succeeding rnds are exactly the same as rnd 5. Making the long ch of each rnd fall directly over the long ch of the preceding rnd make the doily a hexagon with distinct points.

Oak, ash and gold frames look best on pictures with yellowish or brownish tones; black, silver and gray frames on black and white or gray pictures; and cherry, mahogany, cream-colored and gold woods look well on most colored pictures.

WILDFLOWER

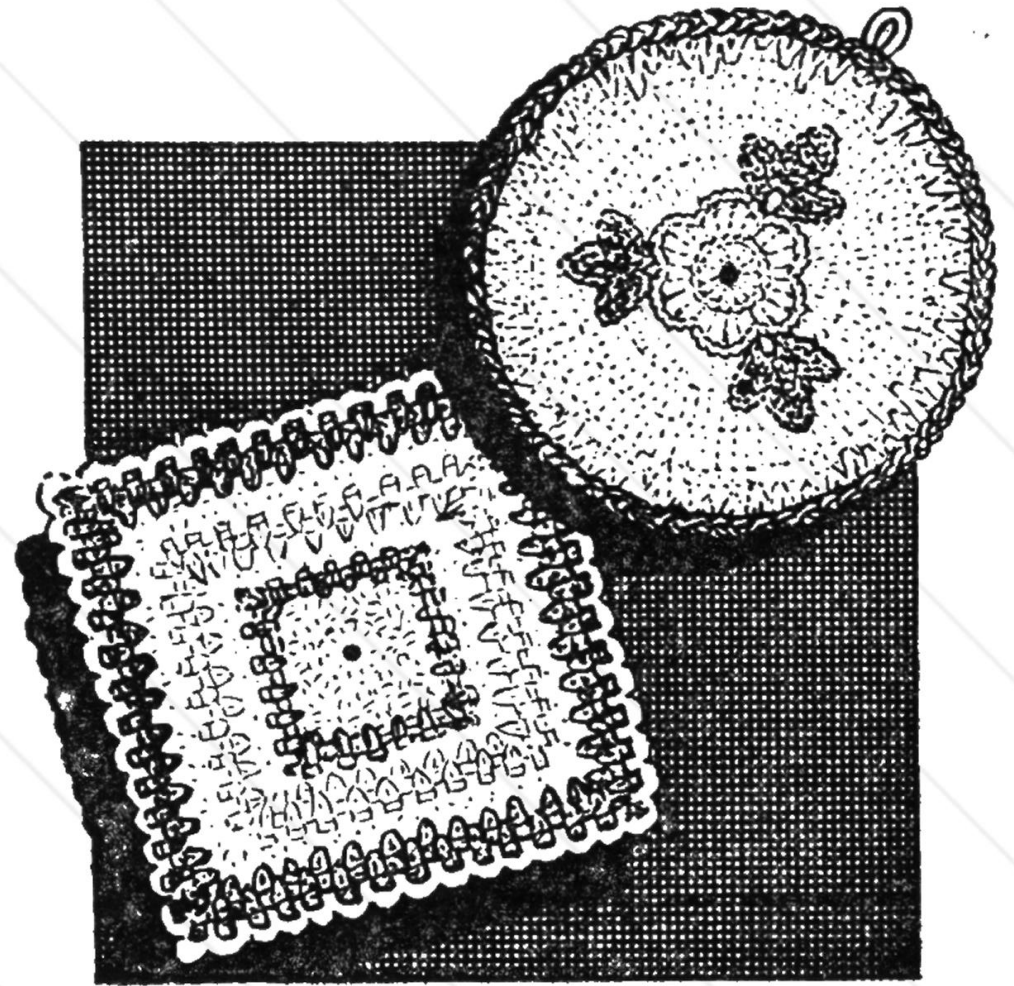
Make this gay pan holder of Lily Knitting and Crochet cotton yarn using a size O crochet hook. We suggest rose, medium green and cream, or, if you prefer, colors to harmonize with your kitchen.

In rose, ch (chain) 6, sl st (slip stitch) in first ch to form ring. Ch 1, 12 sc (single crochet) in ring, sl st in back loop of first sc. Row 2: (Ch 2, 3 dc [double crochet] in back loop of next sc, ch 2, sc in next sc) 6 times; fasten off. Row 3: In green, sl st in back loop of 1 sc between petals, * (ch 4, dc in 4th ch from hook, ch 3, sl st in dc for a picot, ch 4, sl st in same st [stitch] with dc) 3 times; sl st in same sc between flower petals; (ch 3, sl st between next 2 petals) twice. Repeat from * twice; fasten off.

Row 4: Join cream to next 3 ch loop, ch 3, 6 dc in same loop, 7 dc in next loop, * fold leaves down in front out of way, (7 dc in next ch 3 loop) twice. Repeat from * once more. Sl st in first ch 3. Row 5: Ch 3, dc in same st, * 1 dc in next dc, 2 dc in next. Repeat from * around and join. Row 6: Ch 3, dc in same st, * dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc. Repeat from * around and join.

Row 7: Ch 1, 1 sc in each dc around, sl st in first ch (84 sc). Repeat row 7 once. Fasten off. Row 9: Sc in rose in sl st, * a long sc over next sc made by inserting hook down between 2 sc rows; a long sc over next sc made by inserting hook down between first sc row and previous dc row; a long sc over next sc made by inserting hook down between 2 sc rows, 1 sc in next sc. Repeat from * 20 times or around. Join and fasten off. Row 10: Sl st in green in one st, ch 1, sl st in next st around; fasten off. Tack leaves down on foundation.

Steam and press dry on back through a cloth. Line back and sew a bone ring to edge.



RICK RACK ROUNDUP

You will need Lily Knitting and Crochet cotton yarn or medium weight rug yarn in yellow, light blue, cream, orange and delft blue, or colors of your own choosing, for this unique pan holder that is as attractive as its name. Use a crochet hook size O.

In yellow, ch (chain) 5, sl st (slip stitch) in first ch to form ring. Ch 1, 8 sc (single crochet) in ring, sl st in first sc. Row 2: Ch 1, turn, 1 sc in sl st, * ch 1, sc in next sc, ch 1, ch 2, sc in next sc. Repeat from * twice. Ch 1, sc in next sc, ch 1, sc in first corner, ch 2, sl st in first sc. Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in ch 2, * (ch 1, sc in next ch 1 sp [space] between sc) twice, ch 1, sc, ch 2, sc in corner ch 2. Repeat from * around. Ch 1, sc in first corner, ch 2, sl st in first sc.

Row 4: Repeat row 3 with one more ch 1 and sc on each side. Cut thread 2 inches long. Row 5: Turn, sc in light blue in one corner ch 2, and work around in same way, working over end left from last row, ending with 1 sc in first corner, ch 2, sl st in first sc. Repeat row 4. Repeat rows 5 and 4 in turn in cream, orange, cream and delft blue.

Edge: Turn, sl st in cream in one corner ch 2, * (ch 2, sl st in next ch 1 sp) 15 times to next corner, ch

3; sl st in same corner sp. Repeat from * around and join. Fasten off. Steam and press dry on back through a cloth. Sew a bone ring to one corner.

CROCHETED COLLAR

Make several of these collars and brighten up those old dresses that need just a touch of something. This collar is quickly and easily done in Lily Pearl Cotton, size 3, with a size 3 crochet hook. White is prettiest, but any pastel color will be lovely.

* Ch (chain) 6, dc (double crochet) in 6th ch from hook. Repeat from * 31 times, or a length for desired neck size. Row 2: Ch 7, turn, sc (single crochet) in last ch 5 loop, * ch 7, sc in next loop. Repeat from * across, ch 3, tr (treble) down in starting st (stitch). Row 3: Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in tr, 3 sc in next loop, * 3 sc in next loop, 3 sc in 4th st of same loop, 3 sc in balance of same loop. Repeat from * across, 3 sc in end loop, 2 sc in 4th st of same loop.

Row 4: Ch 1, turn, and in back loops of stitches only, make 2 sc in last sc, sc in next 3 sc, * sk (skip) 2 sc in angle, sc in next 3 sc, 3 sc in next (center) st, sc in next 3 sc. Repeat from * across. End with 2 sc in end st. Row 5: Ch 1, turn, and in back loops only, make 2 sc in last sc, sc in next 2 sc, * sk 4 sc in angle, sc in next 2 sc, 3 sc in next (center) st, sc in next 2 sc. Repeat from * across. End with 2 sc in end st. Row 6: Ch 1, turn, 1 sc in both loops of last sc, * ch 9, sc in tip of next point. Repeat from * across.

Row 7: Ch 11, turn, * sc, ch 4, sc (picot made) in 5th st of next ch 9 loop, ch 9. Repeat from * across, ending with ch 4 and dtr (double treble) down in end sc. Row 8: Ch 1, turn, sc in dtr, * ch 9, sc, ch 4, sc (picot made) in 5th st of next loop. Repeat from * across. Omit final picot.



Finish edge with a ball fringe made of Clones Knots. To make a Clones Knot * thread over, swing hook forward and down and thread over under ch, bring hook forward and upward again. Repeat from * 7 more times over ch (17 loops on hook). Thread over and draw through all loops at once, thread over and draw through the loop on hook, pulling tight, 1 sc around ch at base of knot.

Row 9: Ch 11, make a Clones Knot, ch 5, turn, sc, ch 4, sc in 5th st of next loop, * ch 9, a Clones Knot, ch 5, sc, ch 4, sc in 5th st of next loop. Repeat from * across. End with ch 9, a Clones Knot, ch 7, sl st in end sc. Fasten off.

Stretch and pin right side down on a padded board. Steam and press dry.

KNITTED SCARF

Here is a versatile pattern that can be made into a scarf in wool or a table runner in cotton. For a scarf about 12 inches wide and 45 inches long; use any medium two or three ply yarn and size 3 knitting pins. The runner, which measures about 16½ x 53 inches, takes about 12 balls of J. & P. Coats or Clark's O. N. T. Pearl Cotton, size 5, and is made with number 1 (2½ mm. size) knitting pins.

SCARF: Cast on 61 stitches. The first 8 rows: K (knit) 1, * p (purl)



1, k 1. Repeat from * across. Now work in pattern as follows: Row 1 of pattern: K 1, (p 1, k 1) twice (border), * k 2 tog (together), k 5 (0 [yarn over], k 1, 0, k 2) twice; sl (slip) 1, k 1, psso (pass slipped stitch over), k 1, p 1, k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with k 1, (p 1, k 1) twice (border). Row 2 and all even rows: K 1, (p 1, k 1) twice; * p 2 tog, p 13, p 2 tog, k 1, p 1, k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with k 1, (p 1, k 1) twice. Row 3: K 1, (p 1, k 1) twice; * k 2 tog, (k 4, 0, k 1, 0) twice; k 1, sl 1, k 1, psso, k 1, p 1, k 1. Repeat from * across, end-

ing with k 1, (p 1, k 1) twice.

Row 5: K 1, (p 1, k 1) twice; * k 2 tog, k 3, 0, k 1, 0, k 6, 0, k 1, 0, sl 1, k 1, psso, k 1, p 1, k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with k 1, (p 1, k 1) twice. Row 7: K 1, (p 1, k 1) twice; * k 2 tog, (k 2, 0, k 1, 0) twice; k 5, sl 1, k 1, psso, k 1, p 1, k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with k 1, (p 1, k 1) twice.

Row 9: K 1, (p 1, k 1) twice; * k 2 tog, k 1, (0, k 1, 0, k 4) twice; sl 1, k 1, psso, k 1, p 1, k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with k 1, (p 1, k 1) twice. Row 11: K 1, (p 1, k 1) twice; * k 2 tog, 0, k 1, 0, k 6, 0, k 1, 0, k 3, sl 1, k 1, psso, k 1, p 1, k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with k 1, (p 1, k 1) twice. Row 12: Same as row 2.

These 12 rows constitute the pattern. Work in pattern until piece measures about 44 inches in all, ending with row 12. Work a border to correspond with the beginning by working rows 1 to 8 again. Bind off. Pin to measurements and press through a damp cloth.

RUNNER: Cast on 115 stitches and work as for scarf until piece measures about 52 inches in all, ending with row 12. Work border to correspond with the beginning. Bind off. Starch lightly, pin to measurements and press through a cloth.

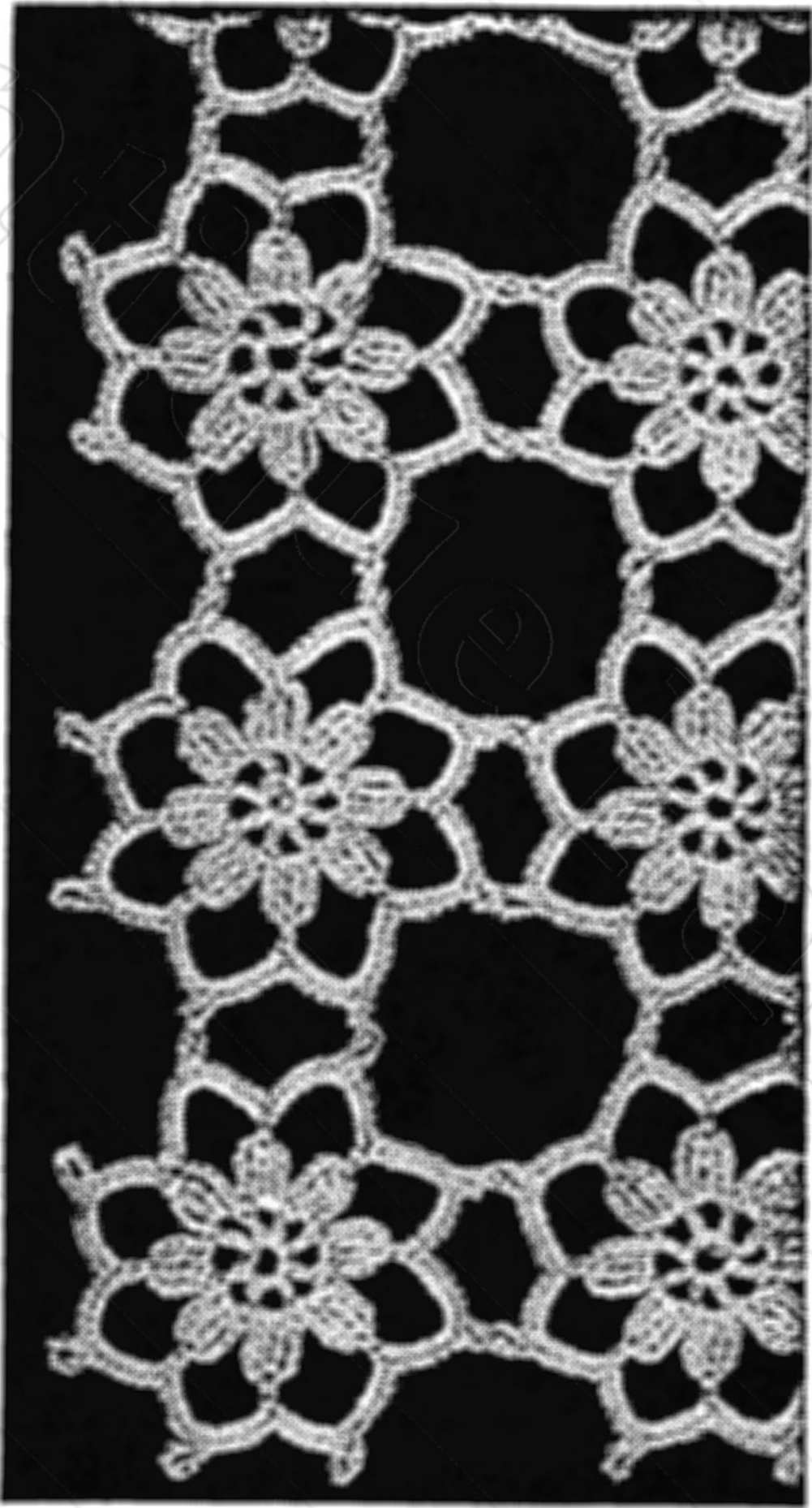
DAINTY DAISY

Exquisite is the word. Enhance your dinner party with a table set of dainty daisies. Use any color or size of thread desired, but the finer the thread the more dainty the set. Using No. 3 crochet cotton and a No. 10 hook, it takes about 5 yards to make 1 motif, and each motif measures about 2 inches across. This might be made with yellow centers, white petals and green.

MOTIF: Ch (chain) 8. Join with sl st (slip stitch) in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd (round) 1: Ch 5, dc (double crochet) in ring, * ch 2, dc in ring. Repeat from * 6 more times. Ch 2, join with sl st to 3rd st (stitch) in ch 5 first made. (8 spaces)

Rnd 2: * Ch 5, make 2 tr (treble) leaving last loop of each tr on hook. Tread over, draw through 3 loops on hook. Ch 5, sl st in same sp (space), sl st in next sp. Repeat from * 6 more times. Sl st in last sp, ch 5, make 3 tr leaving last loop of each tr on hook. Thread over, draw through 4 loops on hook. (8 petals)



Rnd 3: * Ch 10, sc (single crochet) in tip of next petal. Repeat from * around. Join last ch 10 to tip of first petal with sl st.

Rnd 4: * 6 sc over next ch 10, ch 6, sl st in first ch (makes a picot), 6 sc in same ch 10. Repeat from * around (8 points). Break off and fasten.

TO JOIN MOTIFS: Make another motif as first. Join on last rnd by

2 picots as follows: Ch 2, join with sl st to adjacent picot of other motif, ch 2, complete edge with 6 sc, 6 sc in next scallop, ch 2, join, ch 2. Be sure to join motifs so work is square when 4 motifs are joined.



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
